## CLUB RULES

The following Rules relating to Club Members and Visitors shall apply. The Board of Directors may make amendments at any time and these will be duly notified.

## 1. DRESS

a) Members and Visitors are required to conform to the standards of dress both on the course and in the Clubhouse.
b) The dress requirements for both the course and Clubhouse are displayed in the foyer of the Clubhouse. These are subject to change from time to time but members are advised that their standard of dress should always reflect the propriety of the Club to which they belong.
c) In the absence of the General Manager the Operations/Duty Manager, Club Professional and their Staff have been directed to ensure that dress standards are maintained in the Clubhouse and on the course.
2. HOUSE
a) The Clubhouse is open for use of members and their guests daily during the following hours: -

| Sunday | 10.00 am | 10.00 pm |

These hours can be varied from time to time at the discretion of Club management.
The Clubhouse is closed on Christmas Day.
b) Members are asked to support the Club by purchasing from the bar and using the dining facilities. Club prices are always kept competitive.
c) Social golf parties, trade days, wedding receptions, birthday parties and social events are catered by Catering HQ. Members should make enquiries at Reception or the Events Coordinator.
d) Members and guests under the age of 18 years must comply with the Licensing Laws. Under no circumstances are these members and guests allowed in the poker machine and bar area.

## 3. MOBILE PHONES

While at BLR\&GC it is recommended all mobile phone devices be switched to "silent" mode while playing in competitions on the course. No restrictions apply to use within the Clubhouse. Use of mobile phones for conversation on the golf course is to be always kept to a minimum and be aware of fellow members on adjacent holes when speaking.
4. PLAY AND CONDUCT ON THE COURSE

Each member is asked to give close attention to the:

1. Rules of Golf
2. Etiquette of the game
3. Local Rules
4. Regulations Governing Conditions of Play
a) All matches are played over 18 holes unless otherwise notified.
b) The players in any group playing on the course are deemed to be responsible for the conduct and etiquette of that group and maintaining pace with the group in front. Members have an individual responsibility not to take excessive time for each shot and have three minutes only to search for their ball.
c) Players are obliged to move off each putting green before marking their cards or entering scores on their mobile device.
d) In Par \& Stableford events, players are obliged to pick up once they are unable to score.
e) Divot marks must be repaired at all times. Pitch marks on greens must be repaired and bunkers smoothed after disturbing.
f) If players are concerned about the pace of play of the group in front the low marker can bring this to the attention of the offending group. If after two holes there is no improvement, the Pro Shop should be advised. Under no circumstances are players entitled to direct Pro Shop staff, or to remonstrate with the offending group. (See 6 c )
g) Play, whether in competition or not, must be from the tees of the day. If there is no competition, play must be from the blue markers for men and the red for ladies. This includes social players.
Should a player or marker be in doubt of the rule of golf or local rule applicable to a particular incident in play, they should in the first instance contact the Pro Shop for a ruling, either immediately by phone, otherwise on completion of the round. If the ruling is unacceptable to either player the matter can be referred to the Captain, General Manager, or a member of the Match \& Greens Committee. The card should not be signed until a ruling acceptable to both parties has been given.
h) Only hand carts with wide flat wheels may be used on the course.
i) Players are required to always carry and use sand buckets.
j) The Club Professional or his delegated staff will be responsible for starting the field and can alter hit off times and groups at their discretion.
k) Ladies may play in the designated Ladies Competition of the day or in the open event of the day.

## 5. VISITORS

a) Playing visitors shall not, without the sanction of the President, Captain, Head Golf Professional or General Manager, be permitted to play on the course during Saturday competitions.
b) A member may not, without the sanction of the President, Captain, or General Manager be permitted to introduce more than one (1) visitor to designated competitions. The member must play in the same group as that visitor.
c) A member introducing a playing visitor or guest to the Club:
(i) Should ensure the visitor has been signed into the Club either on arrival, or as soon as practicable on completion of their round of golf.
(ii) Should pay the playing visitors fee at the Pro Shop before commencing a game.
d) A member introducing a playing visitor shall be responsible for the conduct of that visitor both in the Clubhouse and on the Course. As far as practicable, playing visitors should remain in the company of the member whilst on the course or in the Clubhouse. Once signed in, adult playing visitors are free to avail themselves of the club's facilities.
e) A member shall not knowingly introduce as a visitor any person whose name has been expunged from the Register of Members of the Club, or, who has been refused admission to membership of the Club or any other Club or is under suspension of another Club.
f) For competition purposes, a visitor must be a member of a Club affiliated with the New South Wales Golf Association or similar interstate or overseas association affiliated with the controlling authority. The visitor must also be of a category which would allow him playing rights at his home Club for that day he wished to play.
6. PRIORITY ON THE COURSE
a) Pairs, threesomes and foursomes shall have precedence over and be entitled to pass any other kind of match. A single player has no standing and shall give way to a match of any kind.
b) Any match playing a whole round is entitled to pass a match playing a shorter round.
c) If a match or group fails to keep its place on the course and loses more than one clear hole on the players in front, it should allow the match or group following to pass. (See 4 g).

## 7. LOCAL RULES

All members/players must check into the Pro Shop prior to tee off. Note the Pro Shop staff are authorised to conduct all competitions on behalf of the Club. This includes starting all club events, monitoring pace of play including directing groups and individuals to maintain their place in the field. The Pro Shop is also the first point of contact regarding rule interpretations. The Head Professional is a member of the Match \& Greens Committee.
a) Any member may use the course when it is not in use by competition fields or other bookings, subject to membership entitlements.
b) On competition and Championship days, no use of the course before the event is permitted for social play without the authority of any member of the match \& greens committee, including the Head Pro.
c) Existing Local Rules are listed on the scorecard and displayed on the Local Rules board adjacent to the first tee. They may also be shown on the electronic golf scoring app.
d) Temporary Local Rules are deemed necessary from time to time and will be posted on the Club's Local Rules board adjacent to the first tee.
e) To use the course at any time covered by a competition timesheet, one must be entered in that competition.
f) Competition fields have priority until the last group has commenced their round.
g) The Match \& Greens Committee is accountable for the management and control of all competitions and their decisions are final in any competition. The Pro Shop acts as starter and competition manager, including monitoring of play. The Head Professional, as a member of the Match \& Greens Committee, may interpret the rules of golf, including local rules. Directions to players by any Pro Shop staff regarding pace of play must be adhered to. Ignoring pro shop directions is regarded as a citable offence.
8. TIMESHEETS
a) Saturday electronic timesheets are available from 6.00pm on the Friday evening fifteen (15) days prior to the designated event. At that time a random draw of Members who have entered their names on the book-in sheet will take place in the Clubhouse and members may place up to four (4) names on the one timesheet slot when their name is drawn.
b) Sunday timesheets are available from 6.00 pm on the Saturday evening fifteen (15) days prior to the designated event.
c) Thursday timesheets are available from 6.00 pm on the Wednesday fifteen (15) days prior to the designated event.
d) Timesheets for Public Holiday Competitions will be made available in a similar method to the Sunday sheets. Any one person may enter no more than four (4) names on any one timesheet slot. No member is entitled to book another member or members into a time slot other than the one the member is already booked into.
e) Online bookings for Saturday competitions are available from 8 pm Friday, 15 days prior to the event.
9. GOLF MEMBERSHIP POLICY
a) The Board of Directors reminds Members of the current Bylaws and Policies in respect to the following Issues:
(i) Leave of Absence.

A Leave of Absence is granted by the committee only on grounds of personal accident or on compassionate grounds.
The maximum period in which a Leave of Absence is granted is usually, six months but depending on individual circumstances may be extended.
A member must apply in writing to the Board of Directors in advance or at the earliest opportunity once the period required is known.
For all other periods of absence such as postings overseas, extended holiday periods, or transfers from the area for any extended period, will be treated as a Transfer to Non-Playing Membership. An application to the Board must be made in writing.
Upon resumption of playing status, the Member is transferred back to their original golf membership category and deduction of relevant fee recommences.
(ii) Cancellation - No Shows;

Members are reminded of the Club's policy in respect to cancellation of a tee time. (No shows)
a) All cancellations must be made before 5 pm on the day prior to any competition.
b) Members / Visitors who fail to notify the Pro Shop may be fined the daily competition fee.
c) This fee will be automatically debited to the members billing account upon notification and confirmation by the Pro Shop that the Member failed to show.
d) Repeated offences to this rule may invoke loss of members booking rights.
e) On occasion severe wet weather may preclude use of carts on the course. Members dependent on carts due to physical or health disabilities may withdraw without penalty but must advise the Pro Shop of their withdrawal.
10. MOTORISED CARTS, MOTOR BIKES \& SCOOTERS
a) Carts, scooters and bikes must not be driven onto tees or greens or between bunkers and greens. All cart direction signs MUST be followed. Members ignoring these directions may be disqualified from the competition in which the breach has occurred.
b) Unless on a concrete path that runs close to a green, carts, scooters and bikes must not be driven or parked within 5 metres of greens. Players using carts, scooters and bikes must maintain their normal place in the field and will have no special priority.
c) All motorised carts, scooters, or bikes, which are used within the boundaries of the Club, must comply with specifications as laid down by the Board and may not be used without the written consent of the Board.
d) A cart storage fee as set by the Board from time to time applies. Members or visitors bringing motorised vehicles onto the course will be charged a fee per round or an annual fee.
e) WAIVER: If the Member holds a valid AUSTRALIAN DISABILITY PARKING PERMIT or a valid MOBILITY PARKING SCHEME PERMIT any usage fee for a Motorised Mobility Scooter will be waived.

## 11. FEE

a) Payment of membership fees in various categories may be made in full or by instalment*.
*Subscription Fee - Payable by Instalment: Available for select categories via the secure online membership portal on the website. Members who choose to pay their subscription fee by instalment will be subject to an additional instalment fee and remain liable for the full Membership fees that apply to the full membership period. Please note the instalment option only applies to the Subscription fee which is one component of your overall Membership fees. All other fees that make up your Membership fees such as Golf NSW affiliation, Golf Link registration, insurance, locker hire, cart storage, motorised vehicle usage and instalment fees, will be charged in full with your initial instalment. The remaining Subscription instalments will be charged monthly. See website for full terms \& conditions.
b) To be eligible to play in any one event, a member must be "Financial" unless written authority has been given by the Club's Board of Directors. Initially, phone confirmation can be sufficient, but should be followed up by written authorisation.
12. COMPETITION CARDS/ELECTRONIC SCORING
a) A card issued by the starter or other authorized person must be obtained before playing in any competition and the requested entrance fee paid. No other card shall be recognized. All cards must be signed by the marker \& countersigned by the player, then entered into the club's computerised scoring system located in the pro shop.
b) Alternatively, an electronic scoring system is also available via an app downloaded to a smartphone. Pro shop staff can assist players to install the app.
c) Unless in groups of two or three, in 2 ball events played in conjunction with an Individual event, the two individual pairings are not permitted to mark each other's individual score card. Scores are then to be entered on the Club's computer system prior to placing them into the Score Box.
d) All cards must be returned to the Pro Shop immediately after completion of the round. All competition cards must be returned for handicap purposes. Electronic scores must be submitted via the smartphone app and must be done progressively on the course. Under no circumstances should either card or electronic scoring be done in the clubhouse after the completion of a competition round.
13. PERSONAL PROPERTY AND INSURANCE
a) The Club may not be liable for any loss or injury to the property or person of any member or visitor to the Club's premises.
b) Golf clubs should not be left unattended outside the Clubhouse. Valuables should be locked away.
c) Members should report any incident involving damage or likely damage caused by a ball being hit into private property or onto public roads. This report should be made to the Pro Shop or General Manager immediately a round has been completed. The identity of the person who struck the ball is to be reported.
d) The security of the lockers and items contained therein is not the responsibility of the Club.
e) Golf Bags are not permitted in the Clubhouse at any time.
14. CONTROL OF CARS
a) Areas designated for Directors and others are to be kept vacant for their use.
b) No car shall be driven on the Club's private roads in excess of a speed of 10 kph or such lesser speed as shall be indicated areas. Car drivers must look out for golf cart and maintenance vehicle traffic which have right-of-way.
15. GOLF BALLS

No member shall purchase golf balls on or in the precincts of the Club's property from any other person than the Club's Professional. No person is authorised to collect golf balls during a Club event.
16. NEW MEMBERS

New members are encouraged to attend a new Member induction session at their earliest opportunity to be advised of all the pertinent rules of the Club.
17. LOCKERS

The Board shall, where practicable, provide lockers for the use of members and charge such fee for the use thereof as shall, from time to time, be determined by the Board.
18. ADVERTISING

No pamphlet, advertisement or notice of any kind shall be exhibited in the Club or on the Course without the permission of the Board.
19. RAFFLES

Canvassing for donations, raffles or subscriptions is not allowed unless approved by the Board.
20. REFRESHMENTS

No member shall invite any employee other than a member of the Executive to partake of liquor or any other kind of refreshments on the Club premises while on duty.

## 21. COMPLAINTS

a) All complaints shall be made to the General Manager, and if so required, shall be in writing. The General Manager shall take all necessary action to satisfy the complaints and, if necessary, refer the same to the Club's Board of Directors.
b) No member shall give any direction to or reprimand any employee of the Club.
22. GENERAL
a) The General Manager shall always administer the Rules of the Club. Members are reminded to always observe the Rules of the Club.

## GOLF COMPETITIONS AND HOW THEY ARE PLAYED

These notes are only intended to assist in the general concept of how various competitions are played. They must be read in conjunction with the Rules of Golf and in particular the Match Committee shall lay down the conditions under which a competition is to be played (Committee Procedures Sections 5A, 5C \& 8).

## Stroke

The score at each hole is entered on the scorecard, totalled and the player's handicap deducted. The player who completes the stipulated round in the fewest strokes will be the scratch winner. Net stroke winners will be determined by the player having the least score determined by the number of strokes less handicap. Note: Other than in Club Championship stroke events, double par applies i.e., if a player reaches double the par for a particular hole, that becomes the score for that hole. So, a maximum score would be 6 on par 3, 8 on par 4, and 10 on par 5.

## Par

In Par play the score is entered on the card in the same way as in stroke play with the exception that where the score exceeds par for the hole, after allowing for handicap stroke (if the player is in receipt of one).
It is the custom that when a player is beaten by Par, the ball shall be picked up. This helps speed up play.
After entering the stroke score on the card, the result is marked in the column provided with " + " sign for a win, and " 0 " for half or "-" for a loss. At the end of the round the plus and minus signs are added and the net result written as so many "up", "down" or "all square". A player will play off their stroke handicap and the strokes are taken at holes as indicated on the card.

## Stableford

The popular method of playing a Stableford competition is for the player to take strokes at holes as in a Par competition using full handicap and to score points on the net results at each hole. At the end of the round all points scored are added up and the player having the highest number of points is the winner. In scoring without allowing for handicaps a player who scores par receives 2 points, for 1 over par 1 point, for a birdie or 1 under par 3 points, for an eagle or 2 under par, 4 points and so on. For example, a player receiving a stroke on a par 4 hole scores 4 giving a net 3 ; and for this they receive 3 points. A player at a par 3 hole scores a 4 but does not receive a stroke; for this they would receive 1 point.

## Four Ball Best Ball V Par

Two players play as partners each taking strokes at holes as in par competition.
If one of the partners wins a hole and the other halves it, only the win is counted. If one halves a hole with par and the other loses it, only the half is counted and so on. Plus, half and minus signs are added at the end of the round and recorded as in an ordinary par competition.

## GOLF COMPETITIONS AND

## HOW THEY ARE PLAYED (Cont.)

In a two-ball handicap event care must be taken to mark the scores of each player in separate columns headed by the initials of the player. If the scores are mixed and it is impossible for the Committee to check the card, the players will be disqualified.

## Four Ball Best Ball Stableford

Played in exactly the same manner as above except that the better ball of the partnership will be credited with points instead of plus, half or minus.

## Two Ball Better Ball v Par or Stableford

Played in conjunction with an individual Par or Stableford event where the players shall not assist each other during the round. The match is scored by recording each player's individual score on the card and the better score recorded in the result column.

## Irish 4 Ball Stableford

Team event where the best individual Stableford score is taken for each par 3, the best two individual Stableford scores taken on each par 4 and the best three individual Stableford scores taken on each par 5.

## Modified Stableford

In a modified Stableford all golfers play according to a fixed score that represents a "par". Those who score lower than the fixed number gain points, whilst those who score higher gain 1 or 0 points. More than one over the fixed score $=0$ points, one over the fixed score $=1$ point, fixed score $=2$ points, one under fixed score = 3 points, two under fixed score $=4$ points, three under fixed score = 5 points \& four under fixed score $=6$ points.

## Quota

The objective of the game is to accumulate points each hole based on your score relative to par. In a typical Quota event a player receives: Bogey = 1 Point, Par = 2 points, Birdie $=4$ points \& an Eagle $=8$ points. Unlike a Stableford or modified Stableford event where players are accruing points, in Quota, players start with a point hurdle of 36 less their handicap. So, a 16-handicap player would start with a quota of 20 . If he or she earned 25 points during a round, his or her total score would be 5 for the day.

## Chapman or Pinehurst

A variation of Fourball where each player hits a tee shot \& swap positions and hits their teammate's ball, where after they decide which of the two balls they choose to play for the remainder of the hole. The other ball is picked up. Once the best position has been selected, the teammates take alternate shots until the ball is holed out.

## GOLF COMPETITIONS AND

## HOW THEY ARE PLAYED (Cont.)

## Foursomes

Two players play as partners and use one ball. The partners strike off alternately from the tee and thereafter strike the ball alternatively during the play at each hole. Scoring is done as for a stroke round and the total is subject to a deduction of half the partners' aggregate handicaps.

## Mixed Foursomes

Mixed Foursomes are played in the same manner as foursomes, except that the ladies use their own tees when it is their turn to play (except in a Penalty situation). NOTE: If either player incurs a penalty stroke it does not alter the rotation of play.

## Canadian Foursomes

Both players hit off all tees, then decide which ball they will play. A player hits the second shot with their partner's ball and they then play alternate shots with that ball until holed out.

## Split Sixes

A Stableford team event where the best one score of the team is recorded for the first 6 holes, the sum of the best two scores are recorded for the next 6 holes and the sum of the best three scores is recorded for the last 6 holes.

## Ambrose

Unless otherwise directed, each member of the team is to hit a tee shot on each hole. The team then selects one of the tee shots from which to play. All members of the team may then hit from that position. This procedure is repeated until the ball is holed. Each team member's tee shot must be used at least three (3) times per eighteen holes. The scorecard must be marked to indicate which player's tee shot was used on each hole. The position of the selected shot is marked. Each team member may then place their ball within one club length of the marked position, no nearer the hole, and play from this position. If the selected shot is on the fairway, the fringe of the green or in a hazard, bunker or rough, the ball must be placed within one club length of the selected shot, no nearer the hole and must remain on the fairway, the fringe of the green or in a hazard, bunker or rough. In a sand bunker, the sand may be raked prior to any ball being placed. The position of the selected putt is marked. Other team members may then place their ball within one putter head length of the marked position. Once the ball is holed out, no further strokes count. Team members may stand behind one another while hitting a shot or putting. The scorecard must show each team member's handicap. These handicaps are to be added together and divided by eight for teams of four, six for teams of three and four for teams of two, to obtain the Team's handicap.

## Individual Match Play

All match play events must observe the rules of golf with respect to match play events (Rule 3.2).

## GOLF COMPETITIONS AND

## HOW THEY ARE PLAYED (Cont.)

## Scratch Match Play

(No handicaps)
A player is deemed to have "won" the hole if they return a lower stroke score than their opponent or their opponent concedes the hole. The match continues until one player is ahead and cannot lose. For example, Player A is " 3 Up" with two holes to play. Any matches "all square after 18 holes" continue to sudden death extra holes.

## Handicap Match Play

(Involves handicaps)
The handicap of the lowest player reverts to scratch (0) and the opponent's handicap is adjusted by the same amount. Players then refer to the match play index shown on the scorecard to indicate what holes a player receives a stroke (Rule 3.2c).
A player is deemed to have "won" the hole if they return a lower "net" stroke score than their opponent allowing for their handicap if they receive a stroke(s), or their opponent concedes the hole. The match continues until one player is ahead and cannot lose. For example, Player A is " 3 Up" with two holes to play. Any matches "all square after 18 holes" continue to sudden death extra holes.

## 4Ball \& Handicap Match Play

Same rules apply as for individual handicap match play except each team involves two players.

## HOW THEY ARE PLAYED (Cont.)

## Competitions Format

Unless otherwise indicated in the fixture lists, all competitions are for both male and female members who are eligible to play on that day. When singles events are played, trophies will be awarded appropriately where sufficient players (either men or ladies) compete. When 2BBB events and team events are played, any combination of men and ladies may combine.

## Competition Prize Points

Winners of competition events are awarded points to their membership card account. The issue of Prize points is at the discretion of the Match Committee and may vary from time to time. The value of the points is usually determined by the number of players competing in the competition on the day.
Prize points earned during the $2022 / 2023$ Golf Season after $1^{\text {st }}$ of September 2022 up until the $31^{\text {st }}$ of August 2023 will expire at midnight $30^{\text {th }}$ of September 2023. All points not spent before this time will be forfeited.
Prize points can be redeemed by purchasing products at the Pro Shop, food and beverage in the bistro, public bars and VIP lounge.

## Ties \& Count backs

The following is the Australia-wide uniform count-back system approved by Golf Australia.
Ties in events shall be decided - whenever possible - by play-offs but if the committee considers this to be inexpedient, a count-back system shall be used as follows:

## 18 Hole Events

The best score for the last nine holes shall be used. If there is still a tie, the last six holes shall be used, and if still tied, the last three holes shall be used.
If a tie persists then hole-by-hole scores shall be taken from the 18th hole.
The relevant handicap or fraction thereof shall be applied in handicap events and a penalty applicable under Rule 3/5 (General Penalty) shall be ignored as far as the count-back is applied.
In the event of a tie in any Championship event an 18-hole play-off will take place on the following weekend.
In the event of a tie in a Monthly medal, a play-off will take place on the next Monthly Medal Day.

## Disputes

## In stroke play,

If an agreement cannot be reached by the player and their marker in regards to the application of a Rule of Golf, two balls are played and both scores recorded. To save time, the matter should be referred on the spot by phone to the Pro Shop for resolution. If the matter still cannot be resolved it should be referred to the captain or GM for adjudication. The competition will not be finalised if a decision cannot be made prior to the closing of the competition.

## HANDICAPS IN USE FOR VARIOUS EVENTS

In Match Play, you may encounter situations where you and your opponent may disagree about the application of the Rules of Golf. Rule 20.1b provides as follows in relation to claims: In match play, if a doubt or dispute arises between the players, a player may make a claim. (In the first instance the players should phone the Pro Shop and seek a ruling). If the matter cannot be resolved the players must continue the match without delay. The committee may consider a claim only if the player making the claim notifies his opponent (i) that he is making a claim (ii) the facts of the situation and (iii) that he wants a ruling. The claim must be made before any player in the match plays from the next teeing ground or, in the case of the last hole of the match, before all players in the match leave the putting green. A later claim may not be considered by the Committee unless it is based on facts previously unknown to the player making the claim and he had been given wrong information Rules 20.1b(3) by an opponent.

## Lightning

Please find below the Rules of Golf concerning Lightning as well as Recommendations of Lightning Protection from Medical Journal Australia.
See Rule 5.7(a) which covers discontinuance and resumption of play. The relevant part of Rule 6-8 includes the following:
When permitted the player must not discontinue play unless:
(i) The Committee - via the Pro shop at Brighton Lakes - has suspended play;
(ii) She/he believes there is a danger from lightning; Bad weather is not of itself a good reason for discontinuing play.

## Recommendations for Lightning Protection

The " $30 / 30$ " rule is recommended for lightning safety and serves as a guide for the suspension and subsequent resumption of activity. The first part of this rule (a flash-to-bang count of inside 30 seconds) is a guide to the suspension of activity. The second part of the " $30 / 30$ " rule provides the criteria for resumption of play that it is recommended that people wait 30 minutes after the last sight of lightning or sound of thunder. It is important to emphasise that blue skies and lack of rainfall are not adequate reasons to breach the 30minute return-to-play rule.
The Match Committee is confident that understanding the relevant Rules of Golf and the proximity of lightning will help provide direction to Members should lightning be in the area. At Brighton Lakes the Pro shop is authorised to suspend \& recommence play. Notification will be sent via message to all carts on the course.

The following rules apply specifically, but not only, to
Championships events:
a) To be eligible to play in any Championship or Special Event a player must have completed and submitted scorecards for at least 6 competition rounds following receiving their provisional handicap or a transfer handicap from another Club.
b) Players will be permitted to use a ride-on motorised conveyance in Club Championship and Special Events.
c) Players playing in the Vardon event section or events administered by the NSW Golf Association or Golf NSW (WGNSW) are not permitted to use a ride-on motorised conveyance. i.e.: to be eligible to win the scratch section of the New Brighton Cup a player must not use a cart. You can win the handicap section if you ride in a cart. (For 2022, see above under New Brighton Cup) The Bowl (A Reserve), Pewter (B grade) and Plate (C grade) are not Vardon events.
d) During special events with Match Play formats, players will remain on the same handicap and in the same grade in which they qualified. All play is to be from the tees of the day.

e) Players who have qualified for the Albert Bartholomew Memorial Medal of Medals will play off their handicap on the day of the event.
f) Members are required to place a "Q" on their qualifying event scorecard to indicate participation into the draw for relevant events should they qualify. If electronic scoring is used, players should advise the Pro Shop of their intention to participate. Members should inform the General Manager, Club Professional or the Match Committee if, following qualification, they do not intend to compete in subsequent Championship rounds. If a qualified competitor withdraws before the Thursday immediately preceding the round, then the next eligible qualifier will be offered a place and a re-draw done. No re-draw will occur if advice of withdrawal is received on or after the Thursday immediately preceding the round.
g) In the event of a tie in a Stroke Championships Event, a play-off shall be conducted over 18 holes on the following weekend.
h) During Championships \& scheduled Special Events, all play must take place at designated tee times, where allocated.
i) Where a tie exists in a competition for a Monthly Medal, a playoff will take place on the next Monthly Medal Day. Players in the play-off will play off their original handicap and the lowest net score shall determine the winner.
